Elspeth McMahon is Old Dominion University's inaugural Associate Vice President for Maritime Initiatives. She has nearly twenty years of dynamic experience in the commercial, military, and education sectors of the maritime industry. McMahon is currently a Commander in the United States Navy Reserves and has extensive experience working for Military Sealift Command as a Strategic Sealift Officer. She holds a USCG Chief Mate's License and has sailed commercially for Maersk Lines, Limited.

With a passion for maritime education and training, she spent almost a decade as an Assistant Professor in the Marine Transportation Department at the State University of New York Maritime College. There, she educated the next generation of licensed deck officers, teaching everything from Leadership to Ship Stability and Cargo Operations.

McMahon holds an undergraduate degree in Marine Transportation from Massachusetts Maritime Academy, a Master's Degree in International Transportation Management from the State University of New York Maritime College, and a Master's Degree in Maritime and Air Transport Management specializing in maritime research from the University of Antwerp, Belgium. She is nearing the completion of her doctoral degree in Nautical Sciences at the University of Antwerp and Antwerp Maritime Academy, where she is focusing on the future roles and training of mariners with the onset of autonomous shipping. McMahon is now working to make ODU a leader in all things maritime, both in the Hampton Roads region and beyond.




FMMS 2022 GOLF TOURNAMENT HIGHLIGHTS

ASNE Scholarship Program

Supporting the education of future naval engineers



Application submissions are now OPEN for the 2023-2024 academic year!

The American Society of Naval Engineers began its scholarship program in 1979 in order to promote the profession of naval engineering and to encourage college students to enter the field. Since the inception of the Scholarship Program, ASNE has since awarded hundreds of scholarships to undergraduate and graduate students interested in pursuing an education and career in naval engineering.

Though rooted in tradition, a constant push for more power and efficiency, the application and development of cutting-edge technology, modern warfare and issues related to national security have aided the evolution of naval engineering. Today, naval engineering includes most engineering disciplines as they are applied to a naval specialty and has become a challenging and rewarding career field in high demand. Each year, rising Junior and Senior undergraduate and graduate students nationwide can receive up to \$4,000 based on merit (academic record, work history, and professional interest in naval engineering) and financial need.
