**Rear Adm. Christopher Engdahl** is a native of South Bend, Indiana and the son of a Navy chaplain. He is a 1990 graduate of the United States Naval Academy where he earned a Bachelor of Science in History. He completed Naval Nuclear Power training and earned a Master of Science in National Strategic Studies from the Naval War College.

His initial sea tour was as damage control assistant onboard USS California (CGN 36). Subsequent sea tours include duties as nuclear quality assurance officer and reactor training assistant on USS Nimitz (CVN 68), operations officer on USS Fletcher (DD 992), executive officer onboard USS Rentz (FFG 46), commanding officer on USS Elrod (FFG 55), Commander, Destroyer Squadron Nine, and Commander, Expeditionary Strike Group 7. During these tours, he deployed numerous times, participated in countless exercises and had the greatest fortune to lead Sailors and Marines at sea.

Ashore he served as department head instructor, steam engineering directorate at the Surface Warfare School Command, Newport, Rhode Island and as a strategic planner for the War on Terrorism Directorate on the Joint Staff (J5). He also served as director for Surface Nuclear Programs at Navy Personnel Command Millington, Tennessee, executive assistant to the Deputy Chief of Naval Personnel, chief of staff to Commander, Naval Surface Forces Pacific and president, Board of Inspection and Survey.

In July 2022, he assumed his current position as the 58th Commander of Naval Safety Command.

His personal awards include the Legion of Merit (five awards), Defense Meritorious Service Medal, Meritorious Service Medal (two awards) and various unit and campaign awards.










HRNM: THE U.S. NAVY IN VIETNAM EXHIBIT

#### HONORING MR. JOSEPH YURSO

ASNE Tidewater Section awards four scholarships annually via the ASNE National Scholarship Program. These four Tidewater Section scholarships are named after Section honored members. One of the four scholarships is named for longtime member Captain USN (Ret.) Joseph F. Yurso.

Joe Yurso has been an ASNE member for 58 years! He served as the ASNE National President from 1997 to 1999. He was the ASNE Tidewater Section Chairman from 1990 to 1991. Joe was voted onto the Tidewater Section ASNE Honor Roll in 1998. He was awarded both the prestigious Frank G. Law and Harold E. Saunders ASNE National Awards. Joe served as a Member of the National Council and as a Section and National ASNE Advisor for decades!

During Joe's 30-year naval career, he became known as a "Troubleshooter." Consistently assigned to Commands to unravel Surface Ship, Submarine and Hull Class wide complex engineering issues. Joe's nomination for the ASNE Harold E. Saunders Award documented his numerous engineering and leadership achievements during his long and distinguished naval career, while assigned to the Navy's Shipyards and SUPSHIP Commands. To say it is an impressive list of accomplishments is to understate the obvious.

For those ASNE members who attend and participate in any of ASNE's symposiums, dinner/meeting programs and other ASNE-sponsored events, Joe is always regarded as an ASNE leader who has the credibility to ask presenters and keynote speakers "the hard questions." When speakers open the floor for questions and the audience hesitates to respond, all-knowing eyes look to see where Joe is sitting, because the audience knows Joe will have an insightful question to pose to the speaker. This distinctive characteristic of Joe's engagement during ASNE events is a testimony to his credibility as a Naval Engineer of note, and a recognized industry-wide leader.

Another outstanding quality that Joe consistently shared over the years with his ASNE colleagues is his deep sense of religious spirit. For many years Joe gave the blessing prior to Section dinners. His prayers give thanks to the creator and all those individuals and values the society serves to represent and support.

Joe spent years advocating for a memorial for the lost crew of the USS THRESHER along with many others passionate about the cause. At Arlington National Cemetery, 56 years after the tragedy, a memorial was finally erected that reads, "in honor of the 129 men

Joe Yurso served on numerous community, industry, religious and civic committees and boards in the region. Joe is always willing to listen and support his friends, colleagues and the American Society of Naval Engineers. Joe Yurso is a sterling example of the great people who have been active serving their country, their community and professional societies. ASNE TW is proud to honor Joe and thank him for his 58 years of membership and service to ASNE and our Section.
