MULTI-AGENCY CRAFT CONFERENCE HIGHLIGHTS



June 26-28, 2023 ★ Portsmouth, VA

This year's Multi-Agency Craft Conference had one of the strongest professional development and technical programs in MACC and Launch & Recovery history. With 23 presentations focused on performance of small craft, implementation of AI in maritime systems, design of crewed and uncrewed platforms, launch and recovery systems and simulations, and electric boat technologies.

As a special treat for the 2023 MACC, these presentations were delivered in a classroom at Fairlead (pictured right), in close proximity to the in-water demonstration area (pictured below).

The Promoting Electric Propulsion (PEP) competition took place at Portsmouth City Park during the conference (see page 9 for all the details).











PROMOTING ELECTRIC PROPULSION (PEP)

Promoting Electric Propulsion for Small Craft is an educational and competitive program made possible by an Office of Naval Research STEM grant. College teams raced their electric-propelled boats at Portsmouth City Park on Tuesday, June 27th during MACC.

The town of Portsmouth, including **Mayor Glover** and **Councilman Hugel**, provided support and a warm welcome. Volunteers from RoboNation, Office of Naval Research, and ASNE Tidewater made this event special for all the students. Congratulations to all those who competed in the manned and unmanned boats. Thank you to the supporters, volunteers, judges, in-water specialists, and PEP fans who made the event such a success. Congrats to the ODU team who came in 3rd! Here is the rundown of the PEP23 winners:

Manned Division

- First Place (\$3,000): Papillon Rouge with 74 points (5 miles in 6 minutes, 12 seconds)
- Second Place (\$2,000): Washington College trimaran with 70 points (5 miles in 19 minutes, 50 seconds)
- Third Place (\$1,000): Old Dominion University with 65 points (5 miles in 23 minutes, 16 seconds)

Unmanned Division

- First Place (\$3,000): University of Rhode Island yellow 73 points (5 miles in 50 minutes, 4 seconds)
- **Second Place (\$2,000):** Florida Atlantic University with 62 points (4.5 miles)
- Third Place (\$1,000): William & Mary with 44 points (3 miles)
