**Captain Hannah A. Kriewaldt** hails from St. Joseph, Missouri. She commissioned as an Ensign in May 1999 after earning a Bachelor of Science degree in Oceanography from the United States Naval Academy. She earned her surface warfare officer qualification aboard USS Roosevelt (DDG 80) as part of the commissioning crew followed by a tour aboard USS O'Brien (DD 975). She selected for lateral transfer to the engineering duty officer community and attended the Naval Postgraduate School. In June 2006, she earned a Master of Science degree in Engineering Acoustics.

Her engineering duty tours include: Work Integration Leader, Habitability Integration Leader, and Nuclear Assistant Project Superintendent, at Norfolk Naval Shipyard where she worked a docking planned incremental availability of USS Harry S. Truman (CVN 75) and a depot modernization period for the USS Tucson (SSN 770); individual augmentee to Joint Task Force Horn of Africa, Camp Lemonier Djibouti Africa, as the Operations Officer for J-34 Engineers; Type Desk Officer on the Commander Naval Surface Forces Atlantic N43 staff, where she was instrumental in the establishment of Surface Team One, development of the surface ship risk management instruction, and Lessons Learned Conference format; Assistant Project Officer at Supervisor of Shipbuilding, Conversion and Repair, USN, Newport News (SUPSHIPNN) working the Inactivation of Ex-Enterprise (CVN 65) December 2011-2012; Naval Reactors Representative Assistant in the Newport News local office from December 2012-July 2014. She successfully completed a tour as Chief Engineer of USS Abraham Lincoln (CVN 72) September 2014-June 2017. Captain Kriewaldt checked aboard SUPSHIPNN as the Project Officer for Refueling and Complex Overhaul (RCOH) in June 2017 and was hand selected to lead USS Gerald R. Ford (CVN 78) through her Post-Delivery Testing and Trials period (PDT&T) in December 2019. Captain Kriewaldt then served as Commander, Naval Forces Atlantic Assistant Chief of Staff Director, Ship Materiel (N43) June 2021-April 2022.

Captain Kriewaldt was selected as the Fleet Engineer of the Quarter by the Tidewater Chapter of the American Society of Naval Engineers (ASNE) in October 2007. She was awarded the Junior Officer Engineering Duty

Officer Diversity Award in September 2011. She published a technical paper and was selected to present at the September 2012 ASNE Fleet Maintenance and Modernization Symposium. She has also been awarded the Legion of Merit, Meritorious Service Medal (1 Gold Star), Joint Service Commendation Medal, Navy and Marine Corps Commendation Medal (2 Gold Stars), and the Navy and Marine Corps Achievement Medal (2 Gold Stars) in addition to numerous campaign and unit awards.

In June 2022, she assumed command as Commanding Officer of Supervisor of Shipbuilding, Conversion and Repair, USN, Newport News, Virginia, responsible for the U.S. Navy's Aircraft Carrier and Submarine Ship Construction, Nuclear Refueling and Repair Programs at Huntington Ingalls Incorporated-Newport News Shipbuilding. She currently resides in Virginia Beach, Virginia and has two daughters, Viktoria Grace, who is 13 and Ava Marie, who is 11.





ASNE ANNUAL INDIVIDUAL AWARDS

The individual annual awards are due 15 November each year. This is about 90 days out from now. Planning ahead, we would like our ASNE Tidewater members to consider nominating one or more persons for these awards. Here is the list of awards:

#### • Harold E Saunders:

Demonstrated productivity, growth and outstanding accomplishment in naval engineering over the years with ultimate wide recognition by peers as leader in the field, and of such prestige as to merit the acclaim of the naval engineering community.

#### • Gold Medal Award (Engineering):

Most significant engineering contribution through personal effort or in the direction of others during or culminating in the five-year period ending in the current year.

#### • Solberg Award (Research):

Most significant contribution to naval engineering through personal research carried out during or culminating in the three-year period ending in the year of consideration.

#### • Claud A Jones Fleet Engineer Award:

Most significant contribution to improving operational engineering or material readiness of maritime defense forces during or culminating in the three-year period ending in the current.

#### • Frank C Jones Award:

Recognizes Naval Engineering professionals who, over a period of the last ten years, culminating in the most recent previous year, have substantially and significantly contributed to their agency's intermediate and/or depot-level ship maintenance and/or alteration programs.

#### • Frank G Law Award (Service to the Society):

Outstanding and long-term significant contributions, though individual effort or by the direction of others to the society – improvement of society operations, advancement of society objectives, advancement of professional stature of society.

#### • Rosenblatt Young Naval Engineer Award:

Person not more than 35 years old who has demonstrated remarkable, early professional achievement in one or more areas of the field of naval engineering.

#### • Clifford G Geiger Award:

Naval Logistics professionals who have demonstrated exceptional leadership and influence within the naval logistics community determined efforts to strengthen the synergy between engineering and logistics.

#### • President's Awards:

Section Chair recommendation to recognize special individuals who have contributed significantly to ASNE during the past year.

ASNE President: Vice Admiral David Lewis, USN (Ret.); (07/01/2023 - 06/30/2025)


#### ASNE President's Bio:

He previously served as a professor of the practice at the Naval Postgraduate School, preceded by 41 years of active duty US Navy service as a Surface Warfare Officer and Engineering Duty Officer, retiring in 2020 at the rank of Vice Admiral. Vice Admiral Lewis earned bachelor's and master's degrees in computer science and has completed academic work in weapons engineering. David is currently studying towards a doctorate in leadership and learning in organizations. He is a life member of ASNE and has served the Society in multiple roles, from Section events coordinator, two-time Section President, ASNE Council and, most recently, as one of three Society Vice Presidents. David is a frequent contributor to the ASNE Naval Engineers Journal, USNI Proceedings, and other naval publications on the topics of innovative engineering, program management, naval history, and hastening Fleet adoption of progressive technology and advanced engineering practices.
