Founded in 1888, the American Society of Naval Engineers (ASNE) is the leading professional engineering society for engineers, scientists and allied professionals who *conceive* 





design develop test construct operate and maintain complex naval and maritime ships, submarines and aircraft and their associated systems and subsystems.

ASNE also serves the educators who train the professionals, researchers who develop related technology, and students who are preparing for the profession. Society activities provide support for the U.S. Navy, U.S. Coast Guard, U.S. Marine Corps, U.S. Merchant Marine and U.S. Army (watercraft).
