RADM Mark Hugel, USN (Ret), was commissioned in June 1977 after earning a Bachelor of Science degree in Systems Engineering from the United States Naval Academy. He was accepted into the Navy Nuclear Propulsion Program and was subsequently assigned to sea tours in USS ENTERPRISE (CVN 65), USS MISSISSIPPI (CGN 40) and USS ABRAHAM LINCOLN (CVN 72). While assigned to MISSISSIPPI, he was designated a Surface Warfare Officer and during his tour in ABRAHAM LINCOLN, he was accepted for lateral transfer into the Navy's Engineering Duty Officer Program. In June 1992, Rear Admiral Hugel completed his graduate education at the Massachusetts Institute of Technology, earning a Master of Science degree in Naval Architecture and Marine Engineering, and a Master of Science degree in Mechanical Engineering. He subsequently served in acquisition, shipbuilding and ship maintenance tours at Supervisor of Shipbuilding, Newport News, VA and Norfolk Naval Shipyard, Portsmouth, VA. In his third tour at Norfolk Naval Shipyard, he was the 100th Shipyard Commander. After promotion to Flag rank, he was Deputy Director for Fleet Readiness on the Chief of Naval Operations staff, and his last active duty assignment was as Deputy Commander, Logistics, Maintenance and Industrial Operations (SEA04), at the Naval Sea Systems Command. After retiring from the Navy in 2009, he began


his employment with CACI and was selected to lead CACI's Norfolk, Virginia office. During his tenure at CACI, he was initially the Division Group Manager and Operating Group Manager for Navy Logistics, and subsequently led the initial stand-up of the Logistics and Materiel Readiness (LMR) market team. His current assignment is as Senior Vice President and leader of CACI's Submarine Logistics and Product Lifecycle Management campaign team, continuing his lifelong work as a logistics and maintenance professional.

SCHOLARSHIP NAMED FOR MR. PAUL SIEBEKING

ASNE Tidewater Section provides four (4) scholarships each year to college Engineering students focused on Naval Engineering as their future career paths. These scholarships bear the names of honored Section members. In this and future newsletters, the background biographies of the four named Section scholarship honorees will be highlighted.

The most recent scholarship honoree is **Mr. Paul Siebeking**. Paul graduated from Kings Point in 1969. He subsequently had very successful careers in both Naval and Industry Engineering Leadership positions. He was Commanding Officer of a Naval PERA Surface Organization and as a Navy Captain, assistant to the Fleet Maintenance Officer (FMO). He was a Group Manager in the QED Corporation.

For the American Society of Engineers (ASNE) and specifically the Tidewater Section of ASNE, Paul has been one of the Society's stalwart members. Highlighting only some of his contributions at this point is appropriate. Paul is a 50-year ASNE Member. He was an ASNE National Councilor for Region III for more than two decades. He attended ASNE National Council Meetings in person for many years to represent Region III. Paul was a long serving member of the Tidewater Section Executive Board and Section Membership Chairman; maintaining the membership list and publishing the Section Membership Directory and History. He developed, maintained and managed membership name tags for all Section events. He was one of the founding members and organizers of the first East Coast Navy Fleet Maintenance Symposium (FMS) and experienced contributor to the FMS and Fleet Maintenance and Modernization Symposia (FMMS) that have followed. Paul was named to the Tidewater Section Honor Roll in 2013.

Always willing to contribute in a positive way to Society and Section, Paul consistently put his many management and engineering talents to work for the betterment and health of The American Society of Naval Engineers and Section Membership.

Paul will be recognized and honored at the ASNE TW Dinner/ Meeting Program on September 18, 2019. We look forward to showing him our appreciation for his service!




