120	Section membership on 01Jul22 is 420. As of 30Jun23 it is 427. $(427/420) \times 100 = 119.6$
144	As of 30Jun23, Section has 22 members, < 30 yr old members. $22/305 = 7.21\%$. $7.21 * 20 = 144$
157	Section gained 8, < 30 yr old members, from 01Jul22 to 30Jun23. $(22/14) \times 100 = 157$
100	Section sponsors one student section
250	Section spawns and charters a Chapter or new Section.
771	
370	Section holds seven meetings of which one is with SNAME and one is with MTS. $(7*50) + (2*10) = 370$
